Mr. Scott F. Miller assumed his present position as Deputy Director of Training and Leader Development, Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff, Army G-3/5/7, in December 2007. In that capacity he serves as the primary advisor and deputy to the Director of Army Training responsible for policy development, monitoring, coordinating and resourcing active and Reserve component individual and collective training in Army units and schools. He focuses on air and ground collective training, training sustainment infrastructure, combat training centers, National Guard and Army Reserve support, joint exercises, distributed learning, professional military education, functional skills training, and leader development. He is also the co-chair of the Title 10 Training Program Evaluation Group.

Mr. Miller was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in Armor following graduation from the U.S. Military Academy. He served on active duty from 1972 to 2003 in a wide range of assignments in Germany, the Republic of Korea, Saudi Arabia, Iraq and the United States. He has two previous assignments as the Deputy Director of Training and also served as the Director of Training for U.S. Army Europe.

He holds a Master of Military Art and Science degree from the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College. He is also a graduate of the U.S. Army War College. His awards and decorations include the Legion of Merit with two Oak Leaf Clusters and the Bronze Star Medal.
