The meeting allowed the Principals to continue to build relationships and, through learning and engagement on partnership progress, inspire continued advancement of the SERPPAS mission in the southeast United States. The meeting successfully highlighted the climate resilience challenges and opportunities that the State of Mississippi faces that are connected to many of the SERPPAS priorities and actions in the SERPPAS Strategic Plan. - The Biden-Harris Administration issued the first-ever national, legally enforceable drinking water standard to protect communities from exposure to harmful per-and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS), also known as 'forever chemicals.' This final rule represents the most significant step to protect public health under EPA's PFAS Strategic Roadmap. The final rule will reduce PFAS exposure for approximately 100 million people, prevent thousands of deaths, and reduce tens of thousands of serious illnesses. Today's announcement complements President Biden's government-wide

- The REPI Program released the 2024 REPI Report to Congress summarizing the program's investments at 124 locations across 37 states and territories, highlighting partnerships across local, state, and Federal agencies, and showcasing mutually beneficial projects in the Pacific Region. - The National Fish and Wildlife Foundation announced the release of the 2024 Southeast Aquatics Fund Request for Proposals . This RFP expects to award approximately \$8.4 million in federal and private sector funding in support of projects that will benefit aquatic habitat quality and connectivity, and conservation practices on working agricultural lands to benefit water quality. The National Park Service will provide \$40 million in funding from unobligated Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) State and Local Assistance Program balances as a potential match for REPI Program funding to support projects that will provide outdoor recreation opportunities to military families and the public while also promoting military readiness and resilience. - The National Fish and Wildlife Foundation announced \$33.5 million in conservation grants from the Longleaf Landscape Stewardship Fund to restore, enhance, and protect longleaf pine forests in eight southern states. This year's grant slate is the largest in the program's history, building on a recent trend of increased funding for longleaf pine restoration. These grants will leverage \$21.2 million in matching contributions to generate a total conservation impact of \$54.7 million. These funded projects each help to advance the restoration goals of America's Longleaf Restoration Initiative laid out in the Range-wide Conservation Plan (2025-2040). 
