**Purpose:** Identify best practices and policy alternatives for efficient, coordinated, transparent, and successful project review and permitting by local, state, and federal agencies for nature-based infrastructure and restoration projects within the SERPPAS geography.

**Need:** Project development teams and funders have repeatedly found that regulatory review and permitting can create challenges for implementation of nature-based solutions in the SERPPAS region along timelines and at scales that key stakeholders need. Reviews and permits ensure important resources are protected, therefore looking for a path to address a more efficient and effective process will promote better outcomes for restoration and climate resilience.
