## **BACKGROUND**

Key to this is access to open lands and ranges in the Southeast, which are nestled within a mosaic of natural and working lands and coastlines, including federal, state, and private ownership. SERPPAS promotes and protects warfighter readiness through sustainable land protection and management, ensuring that these landscapes remain accessible and functional for future generations of warfighters in support of our Nation's defense.
